Awards

Team entries will divide the prize among all members.

☐ Create aesthetically pleasing, functional fabric and garment designs for target consumers
☐ All portions of the entry must be received by April 9, 2015
STEP 1: Design Your Collection
☐ Select one color palette from the <u>Pantone Winter 2016 Trend Palettes</u> a inspiration for designs

Composition Entry Charklist

- ☐ Use technical sketches (CAD, hand drawn, etc.) to illustrate your outwear collection including at least three different garment designs (accessories may be included also, e.g., hats, gloves, scarves)
- ☐ Engineered or allover prints should be illustrated to show accurate placement and scale on the garment and/or accessory
- ☐ Point out technical features of fabric (e.g., water repellency) or garment design (e.g., solar panel) on the sketches
- ☐ Consider garment construction details that enhance garment performance

STEP 2: Present Designs in a Storyboard

Create a single storyboard including the following elements:

- ☐ Garment sketches or illustrations
- ☐ Include fashion sketches, text, or design inspirations to enhance overall visual appeal
- ☐ Describe performance features of collection such as technical fabrics/finishes, construction details, etc.
- ☐ All text in the English language
- ☐ Save storyboard as single PDF file
- ☐ Save storyboard with the entry title as the file name (NO student names, etc. in file name)
- ☐ No less than 150 dpi resolution
- ☐ File size no more than 8 MB

STEP 3: Submit Storyboard

- ☐ Join AATCC <u>online</u> or submit <u>membership application</u> with US\$35 (if not already a member)
- ☐ Submit completed entry form online (DO NOT FAX OR MAIL)
